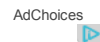

Thanks to my local library, I was able to read the review published in "The Australian" on October 18th. This was the first Aussie review that I've actually been able to get my hands on; thankfully, it was a good one.

The reviewer, Lee Christofis, calls Bea "a captivating raconteur";

offers a positive description of the show, which includes "just enough expletives to make her real"; then concludes by saying that the "piece de resistance, and the show's apex," is Bea's rendition of "Pirate Jenny":

"Bathed in blood-red light, Arthur's voice, like her face, beomes brutal and haunted...

"Relinquishing her trademark urbanity and caustic wit to expose herself so ruthlessly is a class act all on its own."

The October 18th edition of "The Age" had a paragraph about Bea's opening night in Melbourne, which was disrupted by a noisy infant, three microphone failures, and Bea's "apparent weakness due to illness. She's now cancelled three scheduled and rescheduled appearances on Margaret Throsby's ABC FM show, and yesterday pulled the plug on Bert Newton, pleading ill health."
