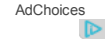

He must have felt bad for us because he then walked over to our car and told us we could wait in the bar before the show. So we went in and what would you know, I was kicked out. I tried to be as persistent as I possibly could so we walked back to the security guy and I told him "you told us wrong!" (For the Lucy fans out there, he really reminded me a lot of Bobby who was the bellboy in I Love Lucy when they were in Hollywood. The way he gave into Lucy when she wanted to know about the celebrities. That's what this guy did, he gave into me! He even looked like him somewhat too!)

Anyway, he pointed directly to the stage door and I said "is that where she'll be coming out?" He told me yes. A few minutes later as we were waiting in the car, I spotted Billy Goldenberg coming out the stage door! And he was all alone! I ran over to him, we talked for a good amount of time and he told me I could meet Bea through him, and from there, Billy, me, and the exceptionally nice security guy worked it all out from there.

After the show, my mom and I waited for him to get the ok from Billy from Bea and we were let in. And by that time, a crowd of fans had formed and I could just hear them all muttering "how come they get to go in!" I can even remember a girl asking the security guy "would Bea sign these?" He acted like it wasn't likely. And I did feel bad for her and her partner because they were very polite. But at least they probably got to watch her leave in the Town Car because it was parked right there! (My mom and I didn't wait for Bea to actually leave the venue.) I'm just so grateful the security guy didn't just tell me to bug off in the first place. He even told me and my mom exactly what hotel Bea was staying at but I didn't want to have to go that route. Even then, it was also Billy who really was the real person who helped me to meet her.

May I make a few more comments about the Galveston experience?

I believe that a performer owes us nothing more than a good performance. Bea definitely gave us that. I don't think that she was at her best Saturday

night, but that was due to circumstances beyond her control. This is pure speculation on my part, but I think that she might have been sick enough to have cancelled her performances in Galveston. I guess we'll never know for sure, though.

I also believe that it is a courtesy on a performer's part when he or she signs autographs, poses for pictures, and interacts with fans. During the course of this cross-country tour, Bea has certainly extended that courtesy to a number of fans in a number of different cities. It's wonderful to read about everyone's first-hand encounters with such a gifted performer. At the same time, I still feel quite disappointed that Bea did not attempt to acknowledge the presence of her fans in some small way. For many, if not most, of them, this was a once-in-a-lifetime chance; they'll never again see her in a live performance. So it was a lost opportunity for them.
